WEBMASTER

Proposed Barmby Moor Volunteer Group – You may be aware that Dunnington have a volunteer task force to improve the ambience of their village. The Parish Council would like to know if there would be any interest from our own villagers to start up a group on the same basis. No Cold Calling in Main Street and Sutton Lane – due to 100% of parishioners agreeing in Main Street and Sutton Lane that these areas should become a “No Cold Calling Zone”, ERYC has approved their request. Signs will be erected in these streets in the near future. The Parish Council are now looking into other areas of the village becoming NCZ. The clerk has received interest from one street in the village, if any other areas are interested, please get in touch.

Tree Works – six trees have been pruned in Main Street, from the Post Office and up to Burton Holme Farm.

Bus Shelter – the Parish Council are in the process of ordering a bus shelter, to be sited at the bus stop on the A1079 opposite Kimberley House. Also they are waiting for approval of siting a litter bin in the same lay-by.

Play Park, Main Street – the PC has been successful in their endeavours for a WREN grant towards new play equipment at the Play Park. A date is now being arranged for installation of the equipment. The park will be closed for approximately one week during October. The old Tarzan trail will be removed and the new equipment with safety surfacing in its place.

Parking on the grass verges – please do not park vehicles on the grass verges and village greens. Winter is approaching, lots of rain making the ground soft which means churned up and disappearing grassed areas in the village.

Keldspring Lane – thank you to Councillor Andy Strangeway, for arranging ERYC to clean out the weeds in the section of beck in Keldspring Lane.
