Parish Update

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan:

The proposed Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan is now completed and ready for the consultation stage. This is your chance to have a look at the proposals and make any comments or suggestions. The Plan is available for download from the Parish Council's website and a hard copy can be requested from the Parish Clerk. A hard copy is also available in the Boot & Slipper and the Post Office for you to read in-situ (please do not take them away).

We are holding a series of events at the Boot & Slipper for you to come along for a cup of tea or coffee and discuss the proposed Plan with members of the Steering Group.

The events at the Boot & Slipper are:

Saturdays 12 midday to 2.00pm - 1st, 15th and 29th September
Mondays 6.00pm to 8.00pm - 10th and 24th September and 8th October.

So please come along and let us know what you think - remember it is your Plan not the Council's!"

Complaints – have been received about dog walkers who do not clean up after their dogs. The two main areas are Flat Lane and Keldspring Lane. Any fouling of any area must be cleared up immediately by the owner or person in charge of the animal at the time. We have a lovely village, it is such a pity there are irresponsible dog owners who are happy to leave dog mess in our countryside or highway verges.

Community Payback Scheme – have painted the three wood bus shelters in Main Street and also the Play Park fencing. It is hoped sometime in the future they will help with a litter pick in the parish.

Barmby Moor Parish Council website – local businesses, sports clubs, committees etc. are invited to advertise on Barmby Moor's website. Do get in touch with the clerk or one of the Parish Councillors if interested.

Post Office – eases the closure of local banks. An action plan aims to raise awareness of banking services available at Post Offices to help communities grappling with the bank closures. Customers can withdraw and deposit cash or cheques at any of the Post Office branches. Do use our Post Office, we do not want it to close.

Bus Shelters – the Parish Council has installed two new bus shelters. One opposite Kimberley House, on the A1079, and the other near The Squirrels and the Thai Restaurant.

New Parish Councillor – we are happy to announce that Moira Wilkinson-Mudd has joined the Parish Council. Congratulations to Moira and members look forward to working with her in the future.

Taskforce walkabout – members of the Parish Council and Pocklington Provincial Councillors did a walkabout with ERYC Officers on Friday, 13 July. Several issues which need attention in the village were discussed and hopefully will be rectified in the future.

Anything you wish to report – pot holes, street lights out of order etc. Please go on line to East Riding of Yorkshire Council's website, or ring or email the clerk.

Holiday Time (crime reduction) – most burglars are not master criminals – they are opportunists. Nearly a third of all burglaries the residents had left windows or a door open when they went out. Make your home a safer place. Cancel milk and newspapers. Cut the lawn before you go away. Don't put your home address on luggage on your outward journey. Ask someone to look after your house, collect post and draw/open curtains. To report anything suspicious ring the Police on 101, or if a crime is in progress then use 999. You can also give information anonymously by calling Crime Stoppers on 0800 555 111.
