Parish Update

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan: The 6 week consultation period with members of the public has been completed after sessions in the Boot & Slipper and Village Hall. The Steering Committee received positive and interesting observations and will make any necessary alterations to the draft Neighbourhood Plan.

The document will then go to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to be examined and hopefully approved.

Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day at St. Catherine's Church – the church was packed to capacity on Sunday, 11 November and included school children from Barmby Moor C of E Primary School, who recited appropriate stories and poems. Wreaths were laid at the churchyard cenotaph and the Gliding Club by representatives from the RAF, 102 Squadron, Pocklington Town Council, the Gliding Club and Barmby Moor Parish Council. Thank you to Revd. Jan Hardy for a lovely service and all involved. The bell ringers were also busy ringing both at Barmby Moor and Pocklington, and thanks to the Trumpeter who played the Last Post.

Memorial plaques at the Play Park – two plaques have been erected to commemorate WW1 in Barmby Moor. Fields in Trust donated a plaque (now on the bus shelter) by conserving the Play Park in perpetuity so the green space remains and cannot be used for building. Airfields of Britain Conservation Trust donated another memorial plaque to commemorate the airstrip at Lottings Lane which was used during WW1.

Thank you to Mr & Mrs. Maycock for allowing this plaque to be erected on the side wall of their house (Arch House).

Kerbing the village green at Beck Side – by the time you read this supplement, kerbing the village greens from the end of Manor Garth (St. Kildas) and up to Brindley Croft should have commenced. The starting date is approximately the 26 November and could last for two weeks. There will be a temporary storage compound for materials etc. in the centre of the village greens during the works. Sorry for any inconvenience this will cause to local residents who live in this area.

The Parish Council decided after last year's terrible damage and erosion to the greens, kerbing is the only way to preserve the verges.

Holborn Estate/The Orchard verge parking area – members of the Parish Council are having talks with ERYC Infrastructure and Facilities Department about making car parking spaces near Holborn Estate. This will help with the parking problems during the pickup and drop off times of the children at the school. Will keep you updated on the proposals ERYC submit.

East Riding Local Plan – if Parishioners wish to view the East Riding Local Plan, there is an information poster on the Parish Notice Boards. The nearest drop-in event is on Tuesday, 4 December at the Pocela Centre (Pocklington Library) between 2 – 7 pm.
