Parish Update

Tour de Yorkshire – well done to everyone in the parish who participated in this wonderful event. How proud we should be of the enthusiasm and generosity of everyone who dressed the village and Sutton Lane. Main Street was just amazing, with bunting of all shapes and sizes, banners, Yorkshire flags and bunting, balloons, wooden letters, flowers and so many bicycles and colourful hoops and even a large yellow t-shirt on the church tower. Despite the awful weather there was a great turn out giving a warm welcome to all the vehicles involved and cyclists in the race. Even local cyclists passing by were greeted warmly!

Hate to mention names, but a big thank you to Andy and Lauren at the Boot & Slipper who worked so hard entertaining 82 children on a rainy day. Val French's suggestion of closing St. Helen's Square was a great idea, and this was backed up by donations from the Calley Trust and the Community Group.

It is so sad to see the decorations being removed, but please hang on to all the dressings you never know they might be back!

Annual Parish Council meeting – was attended by 5 local residents. Issues raised being speeding traffic, road markings, the zebra crossing, refuse collecting, cycle path and could the website have local and current events advertised on the website.

Barmby Moor Parish Council's website – there are several local groups and committees in the village. Please get in touch with the PC, you can advertise on the website free of charge, current events or even minutes of your meetings. This might attract more local residents joining your group.

Community Speed Watch – Humberside Police are working with Safe Roads Humber and East Riding of Yorkshire Council and three local authorities on a plan to implement a Community Speed Watch Scheme. They are recruiting a co-ordinator who will be responsible to manage the scheme across the police force area. Local volunteers will be used to monitor vehicles speeding, if the same car is recorded speeding several times the Police will intervene with the driver. Look out for adverts asking for volunteers later in the year.

Dog Fouling – complaints received about dog fouling in the village. Generally dog owners are very conscientious about cleaning up after their pets, but unfortunately a few are not responsible.

Front Street – you may have noticed the Front Street name sign has disappeared. East Riding of Yorkshire Highways have removed as the name is no longer valid. Have you any views on this?

Bus Lay-by A1079 outside Barmby Moor House/Constantine House – PC has received requests to erect a bus shelter at this bus stop. It will be the same as the one on the opposite side of the road. At present this proposal is under consideration.

Local Elections 2019 – Barmby Moor was an uncontested parish with seven nominations accepted. This means that there are **two vacancies** on the Parish Council. If you want to become a Parish Councillor by Co-Option, look out for the notices on the Parish Notice Boards or contact any councillor or the clerk.

Pocklington Provincial Ward Councillors – congratulations on the success of Kay West, Paul West and David Sykes who were successful representing this ward in the May elections.
