Parish Update

Annual Parish Meeting – The next meeting for local Parishioners is to be held remotely by Zoom on the 6 May 2021 at 7.00 pm. Anyone who wishes to attend, please get in touch with the Clerk or any Parish Councillor, who will forward you a connection to attend. This will be given to you a few days before. If possible can you let us know of any issues which you wish to discuss beforehand please?

Getting Ultrafast Fibre Broadband in the village – after the article in the previous Parish News, please support Teresa Bovingdon in her endeavours to get fibre installed through a Community Partnership with Openreach. Teresa needs the majority of the residents of the 367 properties in the village to pledge their support.

Sutton Lane, Village Seat and a Parish Notice Board – the new seat and notice board have been erected on the highway verge at the entrance to the cul-de-sac.

Yorkshire Water – last attended the problem site on the Village Green near the wildlife area on the 1 March. They cleared a blockage and a camera survey showed no defects. The line was all clear and free flowing.

St. Catherine's Church, cremated remains area – a committee has been formed, including three parish councillors to arrange modifications to the cremated remains area. This is to remove the grass and replace with gravel. The Church Warden has made enquiries about the need for a faculty from the Diocese, which takes approximately 6 weeks. Then the main task is to consult the families where possible.

Trees in Main Street – have been pruned, and the PC are seeking further permission from East Riding for tree works near Holborn View.

Willow Trees, Beck Side – Northern Powergrid have scheduled works to a few of the willow trees, due to branches encroaching into the overhead conductors. No date has been given.

Play Park – the PC are looking into installing new equipment such as picnic tables for children to use in the Play Park.

Bus Shelter near the Thai Restaurant A1079 – a lighting column is to be erected next to the

bus shelter, which will illuminate the shelter and help bus drivers see customers waiting for the bus during the dark nights.

Village Celebration – when restrictions allow, the Parish Council together with Andy and John at the Boot & Slipper and Community Groups propose to organise a celebration. This will include closing St. Helen’s Square as it was done during the Tour de Yorkshire. Hopefully we will have a date once all adults have received their coronavirus vaccinations.

The Barmby Moor Community Group/Coronavirus – Lauren Gibson has been helping out again for vulnerable people needing shopping and prescriptions collecting during the present lockdown. Another big **THANK YOU** to Lauren for what she is doing for Barmby Moor residents.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council Traffic Management –East Riding Traffic Management have commissioned a Traffic Survey in Main Street and Sutton Lane.

The survey is being undertaken to gain data on the traffic flow and speed in response to community concerns.

It will give data on speed, type and volume of traffic over a 24 hour x 7 day period. The equipment has been placed with careful consideration as to the site, in order to give valid results, and to comply with the restrictions placed on the siting of such equipment.

BMPC informed Traffic Management about the gas installations and traffic lights in Main Street which would affect the true data.

Traffic Management replied, stating the survey is one of over 30 in the East Riding and cannot be stopped, but this will be taken into consideration.

An analysis of the data will be sent to the Clerk when it is completed and audited. This process can take a number of months depending on resource. In locations where there is a need for further review, the data will be available after the final feed-back is received. The data is also shared with the Police and Safer Roads Humber.

Village Taskforce Walkabout – to be carried out in June. This is to identify routine work to be carried out by the ER Taskforce Team, within the built up part of the village. This includes minor potholes repairs, street asset painting, sign repair and washing and cutting back vegetation. If you have something to report please get in touch with a member of the PC.
