Parish Update

Annual Parish Council Meeting – this is the meeting when local parishioners are invited to attend and have their say on any issues relating to Barmby Moor. Please come along, it is so important to inform Parish Councillors of any concerns you may have, or proposals or ideas to improve our lovely village.

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan – A big thank you to all those who attended the information events. All the comments made together with those received from interested parties and statutory organisations are being considered and if necessary the existing Plan documents amended. Following this, the documents should then be ready for submission to the official examiner. If approved, the final stages will be a referendum and then hopefully adoption.

Queens Platinum Jubilee/Village Celebration 2022 – Please read the Jubilee Celebrations itinerary in the insert included in this magazine.

Planters in the Village – The Parish Council are looking into designing new planters in the village in the vicinity of the village signs. Permission from Highways will be needed before the planters can be installed.

Traffic concerns in Barmby Moor– members of the Parish Council are having a meeting in April with Traffic Management Officers, Engineers and a Pocklington Provincial Councillor. An Agenda has been organised to cover all areas of the village, A1079 and Sutton Lane + Feoffee Common Lane.

Cremated remains area in St. Catherine's Church yard – is being refurbished with a grant from the Parish Council. By the time you have read this update the works should have been completed.

Dog Fouling the footpaths and verges —the great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog, and get really annoyed with the few who don't, as they don't want to be "tarred with the same brush". There is no excuse for not picking up. All East Riding of Yorkshire Council litter bins may be used for disposing of bagged up dog waste collected whilst walking your dog. If anyone leaves bags of dog waste on trees, bushes, the base of a lamp post etc., they are committing a littering offence that may also be punished by way of a £75 fixed penalty being issued. Community Fibre Partnership with Open Reach - Teresa Bovingdon has confirmed that after 14 months liaising with Openreach to bring Ultrafast Full Fibre Broadband to the village we have hit a major stumbling block. Originally Teresa in her research was assured that with the ERYC grants along with the Governments Gigabit voucher scheme, fibre to the premises would be installed at no cost to local residents. Unfortunately the goalposts have since been moved and the Government have set a maximum amount of funding available for the project which falls £19,719 short of the final offer cost. Unless the community can raise the additional funding we cannot proceed.

Teresa is happy to talk about this at the Annual Parish Meeting to gain the views of local residents on whether to go ahead.

East Riding Design Guide Consultation - What is special about where we live? – ERYC residents across the authority are being invited to take part in a consultation which will go towards creating new design guidance for future developments.
