Parish Update

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan –The draft Plan documents have now been completed and submitted to East Riding of Yorkshire Council for Independent Examination. This is one of the final stages towards adoption of the Plan.

Steve Clark and the Steering Group have worked very hard having meetings, consultations with members of the public and discussions with East Riding of Yorkshire Planning. Thank you for the several years of commitment putting the plan together.

Barmby Moor Fibre Community Partnership with Open Reach – please read the article written by Teresa Bovingdon in the Parish Magazine, and give her support. She has been working very hard trying to get local residents to pledge their vouchers towards FTTP Broadband in the village.

Queens Platinum Jubilee Celebrations — a BIG THANK YOU to all who made the village celebrations at the beginning of June such a great success. So many people were involved in organising street parties, teas, food, music, fireworks, teas and a village dance, not forgetting Hymns and Pimms in the church. What a great village we have.

Barmby Feast – well done to the Playing Fields Committee and all their helpers in making the Feast a great success. WELL DONE.

Community Speed Watch —the volunteers are still carrying out speed checks in Main Street. This is proving to slow traffic through the village.

Traffic concerns in Barmby Moor village and Sutton Lane – the Parish Council are still waiting for the report from Traffic Management and ERYC's Highways Engineers. The report will give proposals on traffic calming measures needed to improve road safety in the parish.

Trees and overhanging vegetation, Chapel Street and Beck Side (near Manor Garth) — ERYC will be removing two self-sown trees on the carriageway side of the beck, along with the tall tree stem. They are also going to hard prune back the vegetation from the western end of the concrete post and metal rail fence through to the wooden fence in Chapel Street. The works are expected to be carried out in October.

The Play Park – Rospa Play Safety will be carrying out safety checks on the play equipment sometime during September.

St. Catherine's Church – the Parish Council have given a £1000 grant towards the upkeep of the burial grounds, for tree and hedge cutting.

No Cold Callers – sorry cold callers are still knocking on resident's doors even though most areas are 'No Cold Calling areas'. East Riding cannot stop cold callers, the signs are only a deterrent. However if you can get the name and company from the cold callers and report to East Riding, this might help. Contact the clerk if you need help.

Dog Fouling the footpaths and verges —the great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog, and get really annoyed with the few who don't, as they don't want to be "tarred with the same brush". There is no excuse for not picking up. All East Riding of Yorkshire Council litter bins may be used for disposing of bagged up dog waste collected whilst walking your dog. If anyone leaves bags of dog waste on trees, bushes, the base of a lamp post etc., they are committing a littering offence that may also be punished by way of a £75 fixed penalty being issued. Damaged road bridge parapet at Beck Side – the Parish Council are aware of the damage which needs repairing. This has been reported to Highways on several occasions over two years. The issue is now in the hands of the Pocklington Provincial Councillors who are chasing the repair works.

Damaged post outside 2 Holborn View – this is on the village green. The damaged post is going to be repaired by the person who knocked it down.

Pot hole repairs – there is a 2 year halt to road surfacing. ER will be concentrating on patching roads and potholes. This is the result of the war in Ukraine where tar is sourced and also Russia. This is driving up prices and availability.

Village Hall – the PC together and the Village Hall Committee have joined together and ordered a projector and screen to be installed above the stage. Now waiting for an installation date.
