Parish Update

The Barmby Moor Community Group/Coronavirus— Lauren Gibson has been helping out again with vulnerable people needing prescriptions collecting during the second lockdown. Another big **THANK YOU** to Lauren for what she is doing for Barmby Moor residents.

East Riding Food Poverty Alliance - The Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee are working together and helping an emergency food parcel distribution network. If local residents are in financial need, please ring the ERYC emergency support line on: 01482 393919. They can apply for individual emergency assistance at: https://www.eastriding.gov.uk/emergency-assistance/ and are referred directly to Foodbank Services.

Vacancy – Snow clearing/gritting the footpaths during the snow and icy weather – If you are interested in having a job, snow/ice clearing the footpaths in Barmby Moor parish during the winter please get in touch with parish councillors or the clerk. All footpaths in the village and Sutton Lane will need salt or grit laying during snow or icy weather. Payment will be discussed on an hourly basis, and the use of a vehicle will be required.

Sutton Lane, Village Seat and a Parish Notice Board – ERYC has approved that the Parish Council can site a village seat and notice board on the corner of the Sutton Lane cul-de-sac. Presently we are getting quotations from local contractors.

Telephone Kiosk/Library in Chapel Street – sorry we had to close the Library, but because of the Government restrictions and being in a confined space it was decided to close for the time being.

Remembrance Sunday – two Parish Councillors laid two poppy wreaths one in St. Catherine's churchyard and the other at the memorial at the Gliding Club. Very sad that few people were allowed to attend during the coronavirus restrictions.

Play Park – Rospa has inspected the Play Park equipment with minor repairs required. Please respect the Government guidelines on play parks. Only one family on each piece of equipment at any one time, if the park is too busy, find another park or wait until free. Please be aware other children maybe waiting.

Signs have been erected with requests such as children being accompanied by a responsible adult who can advise on hygiene and social distancing. **Please read the signs before entering.** Sorry members do not think it is safe to leave sanitizer in the park so please can you sanitize before entering and wash your hands before and after using the park.

Wouldn't it be great if dogs cleared up after themselves! – There has been an increase in dog fouling in the village. It is up to the responsible owner to clean up after their dog. Dog Fouling information cards are enclosed in this magazine.

Holborn View – a new street sign is to be erected in the near future which will help delivery drivers.

Dropped kerbs – have now been installed at the Manor Garth junction and Back Lane/Briarsfield.

Hall Spout – ERYC have repaired the footpath at the bottom of Hall Spout where tree roots had damaged the surface.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council Traffic Management – The Parish Council is aware of your concerns in every area for speeding traffic using Back Lane, The Green, West End and Hall Spout as a short cut to the A1079. Traffic Management agree that there is a need to review the situation, therefore in the autumn a robust assessment by Engineers will survey the issue to find the most effective solution to what is clearly an on-going concern in Barmby Moor.

In the meantime any individual instances of anti-social driving can be notified to the police on the non-emergency number 101. This will add to the body of evidence as we work closely with Safer Roads Humber in addressing speeding issues in the East Riding.
