Parish Update

Parish Councillor Vacancies – another Parish Councillor had to resign due to work commitments. The first vacancy was filled by Co-option on the 6 October and the second vacancy was filled on the 3 November. Welcome to Janet Britton and Gareth Shephard who are our new Parish Councillors.

Sam Appleton – big thank you to Sam for sitting on the Parish Council for several years. Sam had to resign due to work commitments, he will be missed as he had heaps of local knowledge to contribute to meetings.

Defibrillator outside the Village Hall - some people have concerns on the procedures on when to use the Defibrillator. The Parish Council have been in touch with Yorkshire Ambulance Service and have arranged a familiarisation session in the Village Hall. Everyone welcome to attend, on 25 January at 10.00 am in the Village Hall. Please can you pass this date onto friends in the village, and let either a Parish Councillor or clerk know that you will be attending so we have an idea of the numbers. This is an important issue, which is extremely helpful if ever you need to use the Defibrillator.

Refuge light on the A1079 near Kimberley House – was reported out of order to East Riding last month.

Community Speed Watch — the volunteers are working frequently carrying out more speed checks in Main Street. They are also counting how many HGV's travel through Main Street. Anyone who wishes to join the volunteers please contact Bronya Emmison, Mobile: 07711137680. Volunteers are especially needed in Sutton Lane.

Remembrance Sunday – was well attended with 71 in the congregation, and was conducted by Chaplain Annie Harrison. A Pocklington School boy played the Last Post on his cornet, also in attendance were army and air cadets as well as members from the Royal British Legion. Wreaths were laid at St. Catherine's Church and at the Wolds Gliding Club memorials by both Pocklington and Barmby Moor Councillors as well as from members of the 102 and 405 Squadron.

Traffic concerns in Barmby Moor village and Sutton Lane – the Parish Council are still waiting for the report from Traffic Management and ERYC's Highways Engineers. At the time of writing this update, Parish Councillors will be attending the Western Parishes Liaison Meeting on Tuesday, 15 November to ask why no reports have been circulated to Parish Councils. Hopefully we will have answers in the Parish Update in the New Year.

Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan - ERYC have confirmed that Andrew Ashcroft Planning Ltd will be appointed to undertake the role of Examiner for the examination into the Barmby Moor Neighbourhood Plan 2022-2037.

Dog Fouling the footpaths and verges —the great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog, and get really annoyed with the few who don't, as they don't want to be "tarred with the same brush". There is no excuse for not picking up. All East Riding of Yorkshire Council litter bins may be used for disposing of bagged up dog waste collected whilst walking your dog. If anyone leaves bags of dog waste on trees, bushes, the base of a lamp post etc., they are committing a littering offence that may also be punished by way of a £75 fixed penalty being issued. Unfortunately the situation is getting worse both in Flat Lane and Keldspring Lane.

Village Hall – the PC together with the Village Hall Committee have joined together and ordered a projector and screen to be installed above the stage in the hall. Installation is nearly complete.

ACV 64: Asset of Community Value – Councillor Gregory has re-nominated the Boot & Slipper as an asset in the community. This has been accepted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council which lasts for 5 years.

Gritting the footpaths this winter – the Parish Council has arranged for the footpaths to be gritted this winter when necessary.

Christmas Lights – members are looking forward to the great display of Christmas Lights in the village, which seem to exceed each year. The Parish Council have offered to pay for the Christmas tree which will be sited at the Boot & Slipper, with lights donated from Andy and John.
