Planters in the Village – The Parish Council are looking into designing new planters in the village in the vicinity of the village signs. Permission from Highways will be needed before the planters can be installed.

Play Park – one of our Parish Councillors has kindly donated an apple tree which has been planted to the rear of the park. Thank you.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council Traffic Survey March 2021 – has been returned and members are arranging a meeting during March and April with Traffic Management to look at future traffic calming in the parish.

Gritting the footpaths – the Parish Council has arranged for the footpaths in Sutton Lane and the village to be gritted again once the snow and icy weather returns.

Dog Fouling the footpaths and verges —the great majority of dog walkers do pick up after their dog, and get really annoyed with the few who don't, as they don't want to be "tarred with the same brush". There is no excuse for not picking up. All East Riding of Yorkshire Council litter bins may be used for disposing of bagged up dog waste collected whilst walking your dog. If anyone leaves bags of dog waste on trees, bushes, the base of a lamp post etc., they are committing a littering offence that may also be punished by way of a £75 fixed penalty being issued.
